The Conductor and Accompanist

As a professor of music at Lycoming College, **Fred Thayer** is active with two primary interests, conducting and composing. As Director of Choral Activities at Lycoming, he conducts a diversified repertoire with the three choirs.

The Choir has presented concerts in every state east of the Mississippi River. Foreign tours, approximately every three years, have been in Puerto Rico and Europe.

Fred Thayer's graduate degrees are in composition with a doctorate of musical arts from Cornell University. His music is published by E. C.

Schirmer, Lawson Gould, Bourne Co., Laurendale Associates and McGroarty Music. As a member of ASCAP, he recently received his nineteenth ASCAP Standard Panel award. He also has received numerous "Meet the Composer" grants. His compositions include a large scale, five-part mass, two operas, three works for orchestra, two works for band, and more than 60 choral works.

During the summers, Fred Thayer is the associate conductor with the Gregg Smith Singers at the Adirondack Festival of American Music in Saranac Lake, N.Y. The Gregg Smith Singers and the Adirondack Chamber Orchestra have jointly commissioned him to write nine works since 1982.

During the summer of 2002, *Ave Maria* was performed by the Elmer Iseler Singers at the 6th World Symposium on Choral Music in Minneapolis and the

Gregg Smith Singers premiered his newest work, *Carols*. He serves as a member of the Pennsylvania Humanities Council Panel and as a member of the Choral/Opera Panel for the PA Council on the Arts.

Richard J. Lakey is currently the Director of Music at St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Williamsport. He is a graduate of Westminster Choir College, Princeton, NJ, where he received a Bachelor of Music Degree in Church Music. While at Westminster, he was awarded the Alexander McCurdy Organ Scholarship, and through his music ministry has given numerous organ recitals. Lakey earned a Master of Music Education at Indiana University of Pennsylvania.

He has been a part-time instructor of organ and piano at Lycoming, and for the past 14 years has accompanied the Lycoming College



Choir. In previous years, the Choir has performed his *Te Deum* and several anthems. His *Missa Brevis* was performed by the Lycoming College Chamber Choir and the Gregg Smith Singers. Paraclete Press has agreed to publish several of his compositions for choir. Also, Shawnee Press is in the process of publishing one of his compositions.

Lycoming College

Lycoming is an independent, coeducational college of 1500 students enrolled in 32 majors. The College is ranked by *U. S. News & World Report* as a national liberal arts college. Located in Williamsport, Pennsylvania, the college is affiliated with the United Methodist Church.

Lycoming operates on a 4-4-1 academic calendar: four-month fall and spring semesters, an optional May term as well as summer



term. The faculty-student ratio is 13:1.

Founded in 1812, Lycoming is one of America's 50 oldest colleges. Lycoming's main campus is the setting of 19 buildings, including eight residence halls. A 12-acre athletic complex includes the football stadium, soccer and lacrosse fields.

Nestled in north-central Pennsylvania's picturesque mountains and valleys, the Williamsport area offers abundant natural and recreational resources. Students join the local community in enjoying the beautiful Susquehanna River and the

various boating and fishing opportunities that abound. New York City, Philadelphia, Washington, D.C., and Pittsburgh are all within a five-hour drive from Williamsport.

The Lycoming College Tour Choir

Conducted by Dr. Fred Thayer, the Choir has been widely acclaimed as one of the finest college musical groups in the East. Since its inception in 1947 by Walter McIver, the Choir has presented concerts in every state east of the Mississippi River. They have toured in Canada, England, Puerto Rico, and Europe.

The Tour Choir is selected each year by competitive audition from the 120-voice College Choir, which is comprised of students from all academic fields. Approximately 40 students are chosen annually to perform in weekend tours, an



extended spring tour, and a trip abroad every three years. This May, the choir will have a concert tour in Spain.

In its six decades of music, the Lycoming College Choir has performed hundreds of concerts, including appearances in the National Cathedral, the Washington Shrine, the Crystal Cathedral, Saint John the Divine and Saint Patrick's Cathedral. The ensemble has sung with the Gregg Smith Singers, the Chieftains, and Barry Manilow. The choir has been featured twice in the Holiday Celebrations at the White House. **This year, the Choir released its fifth CD entitled "Sing Joyfully."** As a premiere musical group at Lycoming, the Choir performs annually at major campus events, including Freshman Convocation, Family Weekend, Chapel and Baccalaureate services, Commencement, and the Christmas Candlelight Service.

Music Department

The Lycoming College Music Department offers a B.A. in Music with and a B.A. in Music with Music Education Certification (K-12). Introductory courses include Theory, American Music, Electronic Music, and Survey of Western Music. More advanced courses include Theory, Composition, Conducting, and Special Topics in Music.

Facilities include a newly renovated concert hall, piano-equipped practice rooms, a harpsichord, a custom built listening room, and a fully equipped electronic studio. The concert hall features two concert grand pianos and a two-manual Moller pipe organ.

Majors and non-majors have the opportunity to participate in a variety of ensembles such as the Lycoming Choir, Tour Choir, Chamber Choir, Concert Band, Wood-

wind and Brass Quintets, and the Williamsport Symphony Orchestra.

Fellowships

The Chamber Choir, that performs diverse repertoire from vocal jazz to major works, is made up of Choral Fellowship recipients. Each member receives an annually renewable \$500 tuition remission. By auditioning, students of all majors may qualify for this award.

Scholarships

Music scholarships are available for both majors and nonmajors. They range from \$500 to \$2500 and are renewable each year. Money is awarded on the basis of auditions that are heard by the music faculty. Auditions are required of music majors and are suggested for nonmajors.



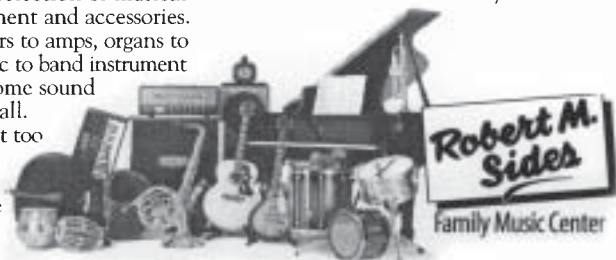

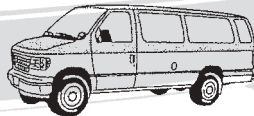
